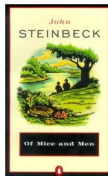
The Moonflower Vine by Jetta Carleton

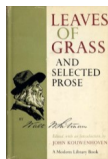
The Waves by Virginia Woolf

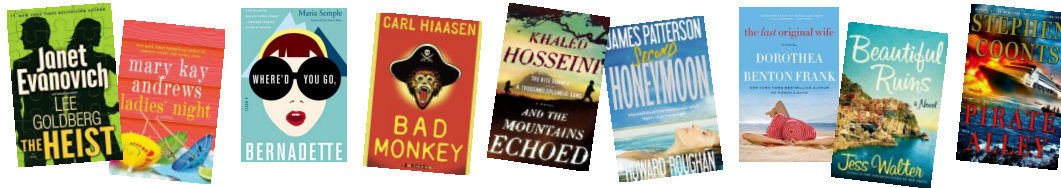

Adult Fiction:

Ladies' Night by Mary Kay Andrews

Assigned to court-ordered therapy after a rage-induced, post-divorce meltdown, Grace Stanton bonds with her fellow patients and enters a rocky new romance. Set in Florida's Gulf Coast. **LT ANDR/E-audiobook**

Pirate Alley by Stephen Coonts

When a cruise ship is seized by Somali pirates, a team of CIA and Navy SEAL operatives mount an undercover operation to save the hostages and derail a dangerous conspiracy. **FIC COON/LT COON**

Sweet Salt Air by Barbara Delinsky

Two childhood friends reunite at a summer island retreat off the coast of Maine, and the revelation of past secrets bring both heartache and hope. **FIC DELI/LT DELI**

The Heist by Janet Evanovich and Lee Goldberg

In this first installment of a lighthearted new series, an FBI agent reluctantly teams up with her conman nemesis—and a cast of other unlikely characters—in order to catch a high-profile embezzler. **FIC EVAN/LT EVAN/E-book**

The Last Original Wife by Dorothea Benton Frank

Beautiful Ruins by Jess Walter

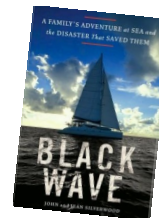
