- If you are under 17, you must get your parent or legal guardian's signature. Your parent or legal guardian must have a library card in good standing.
- A lost or stolen library card can be replaced for 50 cents.

Family Day: Spring "Break-A-Way"

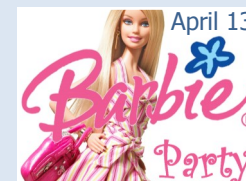

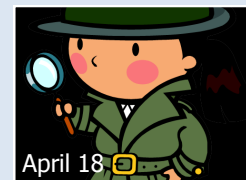
Mini Matises

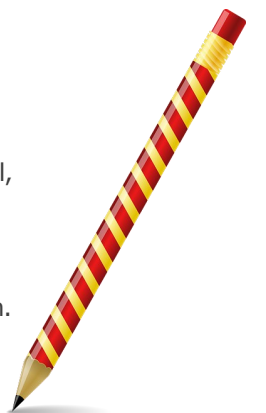
