Imagination Stations Begin July 1st

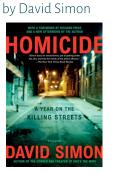

From the Director

July is here and it certainly feels like summer: heat, humidity, and the possibility of a few big storms might be enough to prompt you to spend just as much time indoors as outdoors, and we are here to help!

In addition to the books, movies, and music that we always have available for checkout (not to mention having cool and comfortable buildings where you are welcome to spend a scorching day), we still have Summer Reading events all month long

for some extra fun times. Odds are that at least one of the events we are offering this summer is unlike anything you have ever seen before. That being said, even if you can't make it to a library building, you still might be able to find something the library offers to enjoy.

Bullitt County Public Library offers some wonderful services that you can access online from nearly anywhere, whether you are home, on the go, or even using our free Wi-Fi. You can download new and recent issues of your favorite magazines with Zinio, listen to some great audiobooks from OneClickdigital, or choose from over 56,000 titles to read or listen to via Kentucky Libraries Unbound. We've talked about a lot of these services before, and they really are great.

There is another service that we have not discussed much, and this one benefits those who have physical difficulty reading: the Kentucky Talking Book Library service. Any Kentucky resident who is unable to hold a book and turn the pages or has difficulty reading standard print material is eligible for the service, and residents with learning disabilities may also be eligible (see www.loc.gov/nls/eligible.html for

details). This free service provides Braille materials as well as talking books and magazines and the special media player needed to play them back.

Eligible users may select their own titles directly from the Kentucky Talking Book Library, or they may go through a local librarian. Titles can be downloaded or mailed directly to the listener. When borrowers finish a title, they simply send it back to be replaced by another of their choice. This is a great service that removes barriers to the enjoyment of books for book lovers who can no longer read or easily hold a book or tablet. BCPL in the Community: Visiting with Elmcroft of Mt. Washington

Community empowerment and engagement are at the core of Bullitt County Public Library's mission. In order to carry out that mission, it is essential that we go beyond the doors of our library buildings.

Our Outreach & Programs department is key in meeting this need. Outreach staff make regular visits to a number of community organizations, from local schools to adult day centers. One such partnership that makes us especially proud is our work with Elmcroft of Mt. Washington, a local assisted living center that offers specialized care for dementia and Alzheimer's residents.

Outreach team members Gayle Ryan and Mike Harlamert present two programs at Elmcroft each month, including one for the memory care residents. Presentations often follow a seasonal theme, such as our recent Patriotism-themed program, which included a bit of history and a few fun quizzes for participants.

But the vital element to most Elmcroft visits is the sharing of stories, which draw out long-buried memories and instill a sense of comfort and belonging. Gayle, whose father was diagnosed with dementia, understands this well. As she explains it, although enjoyment was found in simple visits and the creation of new memories, it was through stirring older memories that she was able to stimulate meaningful conversations with her father.

Gayle's favorite Elmcroft program so far is the Memory Quilt, which had residents design paper quilt blocks from templates based on Gayle's own quilt designs. Several ladies became excited and wanted to show off their own quilts. Outreach programs are planned to entertain, but it is often the unanticipated stories and the revelation of participants' varied talents—including singing, dance, and gardening expertise—that bring the greatest reward.

Free Access to ABCmouse.com Is Now Available at All BCPL Locations!



Lately, we have been busy adding new online learning services for adults and teens, including Treehouse and Lynda.com. Now we are focusing on our younger patrons by providing free access to ABCmouse.com for Libraries!

ABCmouse.com is a comprehensive early learning site for children ages 2 to 7, covering reading and language arts, math, science, social studies, art, and music. It is completely child-safe, with no advertising or links to other websites.

The site features more than 450 lessons and 5,000+ individual learning activities, including books, videos, games, puzzles, songs, art activities,

printables, and more. ABCmouse.com has won numerous awards from national education, media, and parent organizations. Best of all, children have fun while learning in a completely safe online environment.

To get started, children just select an avatar and their age. However, parents may also create a personal account so their children can customize their experiences and save their progress on ABCmouse.com's Step-by-Step Learning Path.™

The ABCmouse shortcut is available on children's computers at all BCPL locations; users may also access the site for free using their own devices and the Library's Wi-Fi.

TECH TIP: Access Your Library Account on the Go!





The BCPL online catalog has a responsive design that automatically reformats on mobile devices to display like an app. For quick, easy access to the catalog or your library account information on your smartphone or tablet, you can even create a shortcut on your Home Screen.

The process for creating a shortcut varies slightly by operating system, but generally, you will just need to find the "More" link or the appropriate icon on your display then select "Add shortcut to Home Screen." If you need assistance creating a shortcut on your device, you can ask a member of our Reference staff for help.

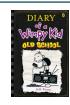
