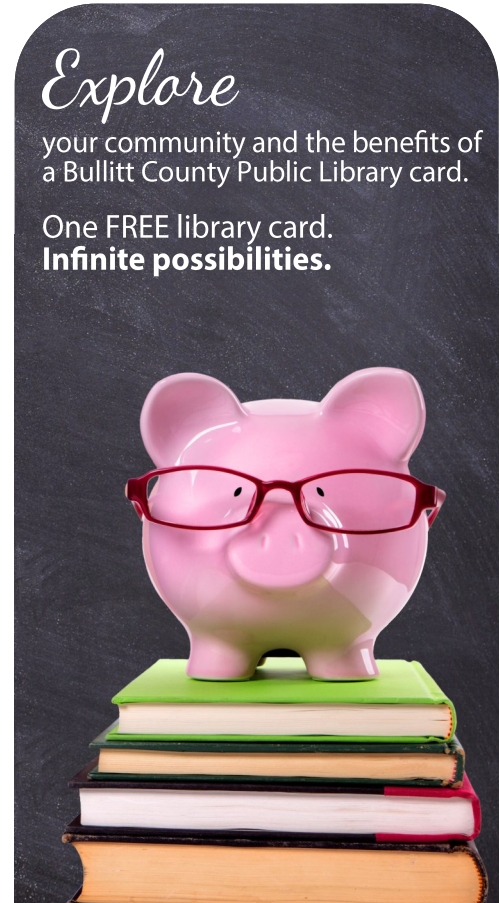

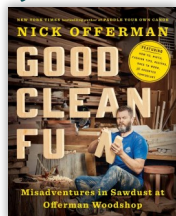
From the Director: What Makes a Library

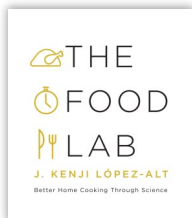

As our system prepared to open the new building in Mt. Washington, I worried a lot over physical details and deadlines. It's very easy to get caught up in the little things up to the day that the doors open. Now that we have opened the doors to the public, thanks in no small part to the amazing staff in Mt. Washington and at every other branch in the Bullitt County Public Library system, it has become abundantly clear what truly matters in making a library a success. It's not about the stuff on the shelves or the number of computers; it's truly about meeting the needs of the community.

Space is important

As the population grows in Bullitt County, space is becoming harder to come by. We took some of the extra time that we had between designing the building and completing construction to capitalize on the personal space available within the new building. Some spaces are comfortable seats to sit

and read, others allow more room to sit with a laptop, while some are big enough to spread out an afghan. The way that these spaces are received and utilized will guide us as we work on new building projects and also when we renovate our current libraries.

Activities are important

Surprising fact here—kids at the library aren't always quiet. We are making sure to have things for kids to do when their parents or caregivers are hunting for books for them to read. We are also putting seats near these activities so that those same parents and caregivers can relax for a moment while the kids play with whatever toy, activity panel, or tablet has gotten their attention.

Discovery is important

We wanted to have something available to everyone, be they regulars or infrequent visitors, that would let them walk away feeling like they have seen something new. We are working on displays

of materials available for checkout that are fresh and interesting, changing out our art walls frequently, and offering new technologies that we think will be important to some of our patrons, all in hope that one thing we offer adds up to a smile, a nod, or even a curious “huh?” along the way.

Usefulness is important

We ask for feedback pretty frequently, and we use what we learn to make our system better. Every location now offers a meeting room, study rooms, and regular programs. We've adjusted checkout limits on DVDs and Blu-rays based on patron requests. The library exists for the community, and the community helps us be the best library for them with their input.

Key 2016–2017 Accomplishments

Launched the new Take 5 initiative to remove access barriers for minors, then partnered with Bullitt County Public Schools to reach more students.

Decreased socio-economic access barriers to library privileges by establishing a \$20.00 fine cap for overdues.

Introduced new online services, including Hoopla, Flipster, and Reference USA to improve access to materials and high-quality information.

Created new categories for Board Books, Beginning Readers, Chapter Books, and Young Adult Fiction to make our collections more purpose based and user friendly for browsing.

Hosted drop-in discussions during National Library Week to speak with patrons face to face about how the Library is doing and to collect ideas for improvements.

Developed a Facilities Master Plan to provide a framework for moving forward with building and renovation projects. Purchased land for a new Nichols branch and for a new main library in Shepherdsville.

OneClickdigital Has a New Name & Improved Interface

Popular e-audiobook platform OneClickdigital has now become RBdigital! It's the same great service with the same high quality selection—including the latest releases from authors like Danielle Steel, Dean Koontz, Iris Johansen, and Charlaine Harris—but now both the website and mobile app boast a more user-friendly, modern design.

OneClickdigital is just one of many ways you can enjoy digital audiobooks from BCPL, along with Kentucky Libraries Unbound and Hoopla. Like

Hoopla, RBdigital titles are always available, with absolutely NO WAITLISTS. Each of our digital audiobook platforms offers a slightly different selection, so if you haven't checked out the previous incarnation of RBdigital in the past, now's the perfect time to explore!

Key changes include:

- Improved navigation and experience
- Embedded search within the mobile app
- The ability to preview, check

out, and renew your books within the app—plus a wishlist function!

- Simplified menu structure, with useful FAQs and help pages

If you already had the OneClickdigital app, you might have received a prompt to update to the new RBdigital interface. If not, you can manually update it. Your credentials will be the same for the new app, and all of your holds, wishlist items, and checkouts will migrate, though you will need to re-download your checkouts.

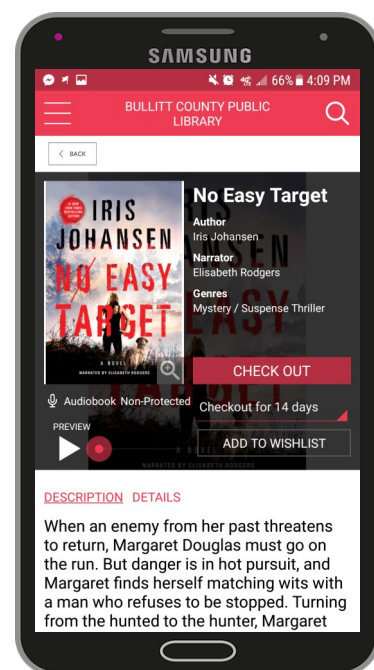
A dedication ceremony for the new Mt. Washington Branch Library at 214 N. Bardstown Road will begin at 11:00 AM.

Technology

DID YOU KNOW...?

3D printing uses a process called "additive manufacturing." 3D versions of a design are created from a digital file when layers of material are printed one atop the other in thin slices until the 3-D object is finished.

Explore 3D Printing

Are you fascinated by 3D printing? The concept is still a mystery to many of us, but a simple internet search reveals stories that seem straight out of a science fiction novel. Results might include a recent CNN piece on astronauts using a 3D printer to create medical supplies on demand, or the Urbee, an environmentally friendly car that is completely 3D printed. 3D printers can also fashion prosthetic limbs and organs, musical instruments, medical practice dummies, and even cosplay suits, as shown by the incredible 3D-printed Batman suit designed by Gauntlet FX and Crimson Coscrafts.

It is BCPL's goal to be a center for learning and exploration, which means keeping up with the latest technology. To this

end, we introduced our first 3D printer in March 2016. Since then, we have upgraded our technology and often use our devices for programs and events, such as our monthly **Makerspace Cafés** for teens and outreach activities at area schools and festivals. Our 3D printers also often appear at teen programs, but on September 16th, we will host our first adults-only program to

feature 3D printing. Adults ages 18 and up can join our Digital Life series for **3D Printers & Pens Petting Zoo** to see our 3D printer in action and to test out our collection of 3D pens. 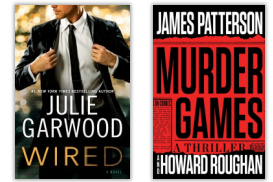

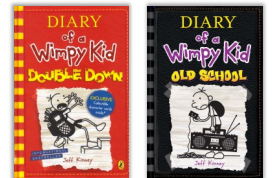
