Contact the Reference Desk to sign up for one of our group computer classes for beginners in our new computer lab at Hillview Library. These take place the first and second Thursdays of each month.

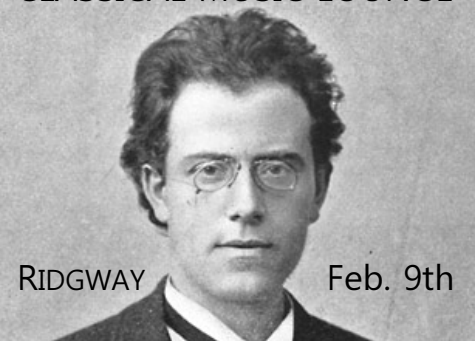
