Is Your Child Ready for Kindergarten?

Bullitt County Public Library is committed to fostering lifelong learners, and a big part of that involves helping children and their families prepare for school. To that end, we're hosting a kindergarten readiness series in April for families with children ages 3 to 5. The series will include fun activities, giveaways, stories, and a free family meal. To help make school readiness a household priority, whole families are encouraged to attend, including older siblings.

Getting ready for kindergarten means more than learning to count and knowing the alphabet. Children need to learn to take turns, to share, to form a line, to listen to the teacher, and to hold a pencil. These are all skills children should have before starting school so that

they are ready to learn on day one.

Unfortunately, sometimes parents become overwhelmed when sifting through information or don't

know where to begin. Therefore, explains Outreach and Programs Supervisor Allison White, "It is our goal at BCPL to provide parents with everyday ways to teach and hone the skills their children will need for success in school. Our Kindergarten Readiness series will serve to connect parents with resources and empower parents to be able to provide learning activities to ready their children for school through their day-to-day interactions."



Bullitt County Public Library Transforms with the Times

National Library Week is an opportunity for libraries of all types to celebrate the contributions of libraries throughout this nation's history. Just as important, however, is the chance to promote the modern library to our community, as many people may be unaware that their library offers so much more than ever before.

Libraries are often mistaken for dull places good for nothing but finding and checking out books. While we do still offer a wide variety of traditional books for all ages, we also offer e-books, a variety of audiobook formats, movies, music CDs, and tablets designed just for children. We even have full-size woodworking plans, complete with traceable patterns. And the modern library isn't just limited to the items available on the shelves; we have moved far beyond just being a place to grab something to read.

One notable thing about modern libraries that perhaps isn't well known is their role in supporting education, and BCPL strives to do this for every age. We offer programs that bring together parents and toddlers, designed to foster a love for reading. We work

with the schools to provide Lexilebased summer reading lists for elementary- and middle-school students, and we provide computer access for taking Accelerated Reader tests. We developed SummerQuest, our annual summer program that offers a mix of reading rewards and exciting events to combat the "Summer Slide."

We also provide a number of learning resources, including Great Courses lectures kits and test preparation materials for those taking college entrance exams. Kids and adults can learn everything from Microsoft Office basics to programming through our online training tools. Best of all, we offer another place where learning is welcomed and encouraged.

Another everyday offering at your library that not many people know about is our reference staff. Traditionally, reference helped with research questions, but our staff also act as a public help desk on nearly every topic imaginable. We won't provide legal advice or do your taxes, but we can help you set up your smartphone, assist with a job

search, aid you with your e-Government needs, and, yes, help you find a good book to read.

Finally, libraries have been and continue to be a place to learn about and experience new technology. Bullitt County Public Library was an early adopter of computers, far before they became so essential to everyday life, and have provided access to the internet since 1995. Our Outreach and Programs department has incorporated everything from video games to 3D printers into our events throughout the years, and we continue to add new and expanded technologies into our organization so that we can help introduce the next "how did I ever live without this?" thing to your life. We even offer a new program series, Digital Life Basics, that focuses on exploring new and useful technologies.

So, as we continue to transform to make sure that we offer something special for everyone, stop in during National Library Week and say hello. And tell a friend!

Land Purchased for a New Nichols Branch

It's official! The Bullitt County Public Library will be adding a fifth location to expand library services and access into the west end of the county.

Establishing a new location in Nichols is something the Board has been considering for years, and when the new Master Facilities Plan was passed last year, they set the stage to make a Nichols Branch a reality. On Friday, March 17th, we got one step closer to that reality when the Library purchased four residential properties to combine into a 1.3 acre parcel for the site of a new library branch next to Nichols Elementary School.

Funds for the new branch, including those for the land purchase and the building itself, will come from the Library's Capital Projects fund. Looking forward, we expect only a minimal impact on our tax rate to operate the branch after it opens, if any at all.

To explain why the Board de-

cided to move forward with this project now, BCPL Director Joe Schweiss said, "Right now, some patrons in the Nichols area have to drive more than 10 miles to get to a Bullitt County Public Library branch, and a new branch location should make it easier for more people to take advantage of all the services that their library has to offer. We have witnessed a twenty percent increase in circulation of library materials this fiscal year alone. With the county growing in population and the library growing in popularity, this seems like the perfect time to add a new branch to the Bullitt County Public Library system."

The new building is expected to be approximately 5,000 square feet in size and will be designed to be functional for decades to come.

TECH TIP: Listen to OverDrive Audiobooks with Android Auto



Android Auto overview display. Android Auto is available in many newer vehicles and also some after-market head units.

A great audiobook always makes a long work commute or a family road trip much more enjoyable. And if you have an Android device with the OverDrive app installed and a compatible vehicle, your listening experience can become even more seamless.

Android Auto is designed to make it safer for drivers to interact with phone apps by projecting the information on in-car navigation screens, providing convenient access to apps, music, and more. Through Android Auto, the OverDrive app allows driv-

ers to access Library audiobooks and control the listening experience—including play, fast forward, rewind, pause, and bookmarking—with intuitive on-screen navigation tools. The app is also navigable via Google voice commands.

Don't have access to Android Auto? iOS users may wonder about Apple Car Play, but as of our last testing, it is not compatible with the OverDrive app. However, BCPL still offers a range of other listening options for your travels, including books on CD and Playaways.

If you enjoy digital music or audiobooks, Bluetoothing is also an option. You can learn more about Android Auto and other methods for listening to the Library's digital media in your vehicle at the OverDrive, Flipster, Hoopla—Oh My! session of our new Digital Life Basics series. 
