If you want to learn to paint or sculpt, you'll find tutorials and



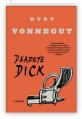

If you're not much on crafting, astronomy, or beer and wine but you really like cars, you should visit the Auto Repair Reference Center. Watch videos



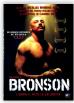

## From the Director

ebruary is a pretty short month, but we are packing it with some excellent opportunities this year. First, we are proudly offering another Fine Forgiveness February, so as long as all of your late and lost items are returned we can waive your overdue fines and get you back to borrowing books, movies, and more. Second, we are sticking with our New Year's resolution and making a big push to discover what your relationship with the Library is currently and what it could become. Your feedback will help us determine some new goals and help us form a plan for the near future-talk about an opportunity!

Libraries have changed a lot since the days of handwritten books and having bookshelves closed off from the public (except that some libraries have gone back to checking out albums on vinyl, because that's cool again) because they adapt to the needs of their patrons (see the vinyl album note

above). The best way for us to know your needs is for us to listen and ask questions and for you, our patrons, to give feedback. It's not a new thing, but making sure that we do it in a productive manner takes a change in habits, just like a New Year's resolution typically requires.

So, we need for you to give us feedback, which is not that hard; we are going to have paper surveys, online surveys, and the equipment needed to fill out either. We might even have a playful competition between the branches. What the Library needs to do to stick with our side of the resolution is to make our new habit stick. So let's take a look at some ways to make a habit stick:

**1. Establish realistic goals.** I think this is pretty realistic.

**2. Stay positive.** That's easy; sticking with this is going to make the Library better than ever!

3. It usually takes twenty-one

**days to build a new habit.** No problem! We are going to do this for at least twenty-eight days!

**4. Become a morning person.** I'm not sure how that's going to help, but we open at 9:00 AM Monday through Saturday!

**5. Change your diet the right way.** Yeah. About that. Let's just stick with the feedback habit, and I'll keep my occasional doughnut.

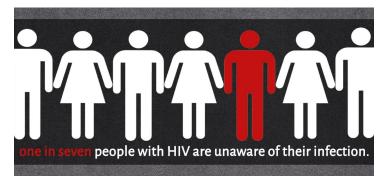

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# **Community News**

## **Free HIV Testing**



ccording to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), 1.1 million people live with HIV in the United States. Of that number, one in seven people with HIV-more than 150,000 people—are unaware of their infection. That's why the CDC recommends that everyone between the ages of 13 and 64 gets tested at least once and that high-risk groups get tested more often. Based on the CDC's 2016 annual report, Ken-

tucky ranks 25th highest for HIV diagnoses in the country.

The health and safety of our patrons and the county at large is important to us here at BCPL. HIV treatment is available and accessible; many people who contract the disease go on to live normal, healthy lives with the proper medication and treatment. But you cannot treat an illness if you don't know you have it.

To that end, we are partnering with the Volunteers of Mid-America States to offer free, confidential HIV testing at all four of BCPL's locations. Sessions take about 20 minutes, and test results are provided at the end of each session.

The Volunteers of America has offered HIV services for over 20 years, and their HIV testing program follows the CDC guidelines. Every VOA HIV staff member that administers the test has been trained and certified for Fundamentals of HIV Pre & Post Testing by the Kentucky Department of Public Health. Registration is not re-
