Human participants get to read a book of their choice to a new bunny friend, and the bunnies provide a safe, encouraging presence for readers. Sharing books with furry supporters helps kids to:

- Sustain concentration and focus;
- Increase reading comprehension;
- Expand their use of vocabulary and language;
- Boost confidence and pride in their reading skills;
- Cultivate a higher motivation for reading and learning;
- Foster positive social interactions;
- Feel more comfortable about school and learning; and
- Enjoy the experience of reading.

At BCPL, we believe that early literacy is a key component in a child's success through their school years and into adulthood. To that end, we have lots more exciting things coming in the future as we delve deeper into our new strategic plan. We're only just getting started!



I'm going to talk very plainly about the goals that we came up with when we reached out to the community for information and advice on our new Strategic Plan. Sometimes we in the library world get a bit caught up in our own heads and use way too much lingo and jargon for the things we offer every day. This is something that we promise to clear up, so it's pretty important that we don't stick in too many of those same words when we talk about our goals for the next three to five years. We are still going to use a few of them, like Outcomes and User Experience, but we can really simplify the concepts down to a few sentences so that we don't forget what we are actually trying to accomplish. So, after many months of research, here are the areas that we will be focusing on in the near future:

Goal 1: Early Literacy Support

In order for our communities to succeed, kids must succeed. The earlier that happens, the better.

Goal 2: Technology Literacy Support

We know where information lives, and we help our communities find it and use it.

Goal 3: Outcomes-Based Library Events

It's not enough just to do something, it has to mean something. We share stories about how our work matters.

Goal 4: Network-building Marketing Practices

We greet our neighbors, and we lend a helping hand to accomplish our vision of an interconnected community.

Goal 5: Facilities Design for Improved User Experience

We are a place for discovery. Our library spaces encourage this for everyone.

Goal 6: Organization Design for Improved User Experience

We are an organization that gets things done. The right person in the right job makes all the difference.

This is just the start of a new way of operating, so if you think of some issues that the library should focus on in the future make sure to let us know as we do the next wave of planning in a few years. When you hear someone ask "what's the most progressive institution we have in the area?" with the community's help, the Bullitt County Public Library will be the answer to their question.

There, you will discover a number of useful resources including:






