

Get Ready to Drop Your Drawers...

Bullitt County Public Library needs your help for a good cause! This fall and early winter, we are taking part in Drop Your Drawers @ the Library, a cooperative effort with libraries all across the state. This project seeks to ensure that every child shows up to school and stays in school for the whole school day in clean underwear that fits.

Underwear is a basic need and one that is easily forgotten. Schools are handing out underwear on a daily basis to children who need a clean pair because of accidents at school or issues at home. Because parents are often unable to bring fresh underwear to their children during school hours, accidents can cause children to miss valuable learning time in the classroom.

To help solve this problem, we are asking community members to drop off packages of new children's underwear (preferably sizes 4-16) at the library during the months of November and December. Our goal is to collect

5,000 pairs of children's underwear. All donations will go to local public elementary schools to help replenish their supply of emergency underpants and to provide direct assistance to each school's Family Resource Center.

But wait... You can begin helping now! We are also encouraging civic-minded businesses and organizations to help with our cause by collecting packages of underpants from their employees or members during the month of October. Then, when library drop-off sites open in November, groups can drop off their donations at any Bullitt County Public Library location.

To provide an extra opportunity to donate, the Library is also working with the Greater Bullitt

County Youth Football League to collect packages of underpants during youth football games in October. Attendees can drop their drawers at the admission gate—new packages of children's underwear only, please!—and donations will be passed on to the Library.



You've probably noticed a few changes around Bullitt County Public Library's website, not the least of which was a message saying that we were changing to a new checkout and cataloging system. At long last we have upgraded our system in order to bring you more features that should make your life easier. Taking advantage of these features requires having and knowing the PIN for your library account, so make sure to contact a branch or stop by a checkout desk if you have forgotten yours or never set one up.

To start, visit our homepage to get a link to the catalog. You can also get there by visiting pac.bcplib.org (hint—be sure to remove the :8080 at the end that the old catalog used to require). On the front page of the catalog, you'll find a collection of Quick Links that will take you to some highlights and new offerings of the collection. You can find the current Lucky Day items and the newest DVDs, plus our collection of digital materials, including all of the movies that we offer via Kanopy. This page will be added to and made much prettier over time, so pardon the roughness for the time being.

Big changes are now available when you log in to your account. When you fill out your log in information and click on *My Account*, you'll be able to change your PIN, change your preferences—including the choice to record your checkout history—

and sign up for text messages. Additionally, you are able to see both your physical checkouts and digital checkouts (only those from Hoopla, KLU/Overdrive, and RBDigital for now). If you've opted in, you'll also see your checkout history. Best of all, if you have any fines, you'll be able to pay them online and (finally) have the payment take place in real time!

Now for the cool part—we have been able to add direct download capabilities from our biggest providers of e-books and other digital materials. You can now search the catalog for a title or subject and find both the materials available in our branches and the materials that you can download or stream directly to your devices. If the digital materials are available, all you have to do is click *Download* and you can skip the separate search on RBDigital, Hoopla, or KLU/Overdrive (and be careful with your clicks as things process instantly!).

Pro-tip: lots of the KLU/Overdrive titles say that they are available in HTML format, but if you click on the title for more details you'll see all of the formats in which the title is available. You can even narrow your search down to titles available for your Kindle by selecting it from *Electronic Format*. Don't worry—it's not as complex as it sounds, and our staff

can walk you through it.

Lastly, the new catalog has built in fuzzy logic searching. This is great if you are having trouble remembering the correct spelling for *desert...* or is it *dessert*? Either way, the catalog will help you get the results you want. The fuzzy logic can be a little bit much for shorter search terms, so if you want to search for rice and not ice, price, race, or anything else, just enter it in the search box as "rice" (in quotation marks) and you can turn the fuzzy logic off for that search.

We encourage you to explore, test things out, and tell us what you think. There are going to be differences from the last system, but we will try our best to find equivalent or improved functions to make up for the losses. So the next time you wonder just who has a shiny new catalog with over 850,000 titles to explore, the Bullitt County Public Library will be the answer to the question.

In addition, we have another new reading program for our youngest patrons set to launch this November during National Family Literacy Month.

1,000 Books Before Kindergarten is a self-paced, early literacy reading program that helps children and families read together on a regular basis with a goal of reading 1,000 books and helping prepare the child for school. Participating families simply log their child's reading, and through incentive prizes and regular celebrations of the child's reading accomplishments, the Library helps participants remain committed and motivated to meet their goal.

Mobile Printing Is Coming Soon!

Have you ever had a print job queued up at home only to discover your ink cartridge is empty? Or maybe you've dropped into the library needing to print photos or screenshots directly from your smartphone? Thanks to recent changes we've made to our network, Bullitt County Public Library will soon have the perfect solution for your problem: mobile printing.

BCPL offers print services at every location already, but soon this service will get even better with mobile printing. You will no longer need to log in to a BCPL computer to get your print job from your device to our printer. Instead, by late Octo-

ber, you will be able to send a print job from your Wi-Fi-enabled laptop or smartphone directly to our Print Release Station. You'll even be able to send your document from home to the library, where you can print it out and pick it up in one easy step.

Mobile print jobs will still need to be retrieved from the Print Release Station at their designated library location. Print jobs will remain available for up to 72 hours. Payment must be made in cash at the Print Release Station; black-and-white prints are 10¢/page and color copies are 50¢/page.






