


Get Ready to Drop Your Drawers (Again)...



unable to bring fresh underwear to their children during school hours, accidents can cause children to miss valuable learning time in the classroom.

To help solve this problem, we are asking community members to **drop off packages of new children's underwear (preferably sizes 4-16) at the library during the months of November and December.** Our goal is to collect 5,000 pairs of children's underwear. All donations will go to local public elementary schools to help replenish their supply of emergency underpants and to provide direct assistance to each school's Family Resource Center.

But wait... You can begin helping now! We are also encouraging civic-minded businesses and organizations to help with our cause by collecting packages of underpants from their employees or members during the month of October. Then, when

Bullitt County Public Library needs your help for a good cause! This fall and early winter, we are once again organizing a Drop Your Drawers @ the Library drive, part of a cooperative effort with libraries all across the state. This project seeks to ensure that every child shows up to school and stays in school for the whole school day in clean underwear that fits.

Underwear is a basic need and one that is easily forgotten. Schools are handing out underwear on a daily basis to children who need a clean pair because of accidents at school or issues at home. Because parents are often

To provide an extra opportunity to donate, the Library is also working with the Greater Bullitt County Youth Football League to collect packages of underpants during youth football games in October. Attendees can drop their drawers at the admission gate—new packages of children's underwear only, please!—and donations will be passed on

to the Library.

From the Director

Calling Out a New Issue

Libraries have worked hard to get materials in the hands of patrons for a very long time. Librarians wince when it comes to long wait times for popular items because our objective is to fulfill requests as quickly as possible. We recognize that dollars don't go as far as they once did. We recognize that priorities don't always align with wants. We also recognize that libraries act as a resource to get desired materials in the hands of those who may not be able to afford to buy them. That's why it is so hard to process the current trend of publishers singling out libraries as enemies to their bottom lines.

Macmillan CEO John Sargent sent out a memo in July to authors, illustrators, and agents revealing that the company would limit the sales of e-books to libraries to one copy during the first eight weeks of a title's availability. He said the reason was "growing fears that library lending was cannibalizing sales" and that "given the choice between a purchase of an e-book for \$12.99 or a frictionless lend for free, the American e-book reader is starting to lean heavily toward free." Sargent left out the part that libraries are often charged between \$50 to \$90 for those same titles, and that the process of borrowing those titles from the library is rarely frictionless. Many publishers limit the availability of e-books to a single use at a time per copy, so the library has to purchase additional copies to meet demand lest the wait list gets too long. Additionally, many publishers limit either the length of time a title is available (two years and it disappears from our collection) or the number of checkouts available (twenty-six checkouts is the new normal).


Most of the issue is a matter of production. Publishers released more than 300,000 new and previously published titles in 2013 alone, and another 1,000,000 titles were self-published in 2017. We can't possibly buy a copy of every title that comes out, and some titles will always be more popular than others. With so many titles being released every year, the more than 16,000 public libraries

across the country cannot be impacting sales very much, either positively or negatively, and supplemental data says that our work drives sales in other ways. According to the article "The Case For Libraries" by David Vinjamuri (in *Publishers Weekly*), readers who use the library are still also buying books. Sixty percent of frequent library users have also bought a book written by an author they first read in a library. Roughly a third of people who bought a book in the last month also read one from the library in that same month. Statistics suggest library readers are more likely to buy hardbacks than other buyers. Libraries help drive sales by helping readers find new authors. In short, libraries help merchandise authors for publishers.


